Net Game

Directions: Laminate cards and 8 1/2" x 11" page with net.

Cut out the animals and insect cards. The net will stay on the 8 1/2" x 11" page and will not need to be cut out.

Activities: Talk about what kinds of things can be caught with a net. Things like insects, small fish, and other things can be caught in a net.

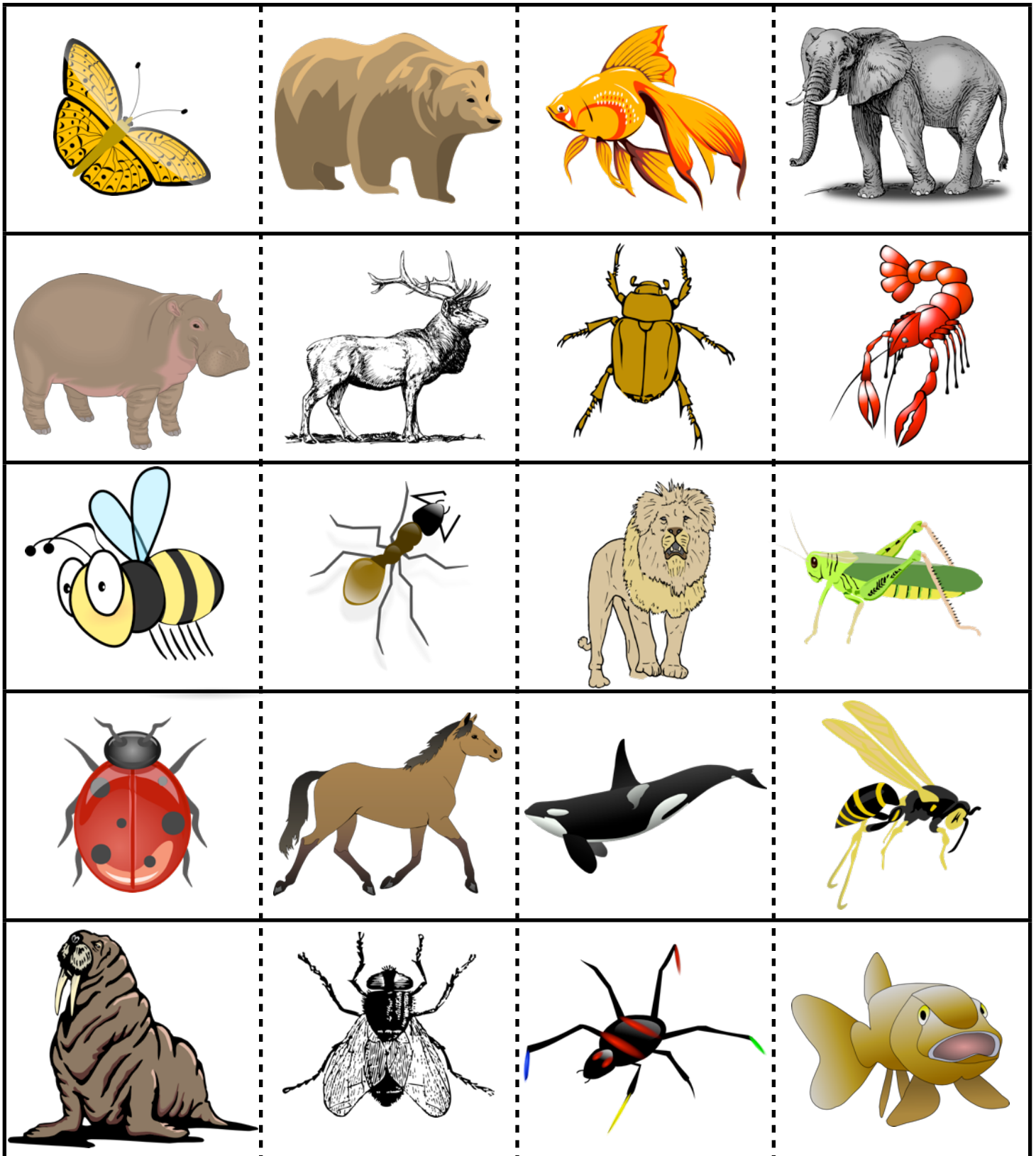
Stack cards and go through the list and ask child if various creatures will fit into the net. When the child guesses correctly, add the creature to the net using blue tack.

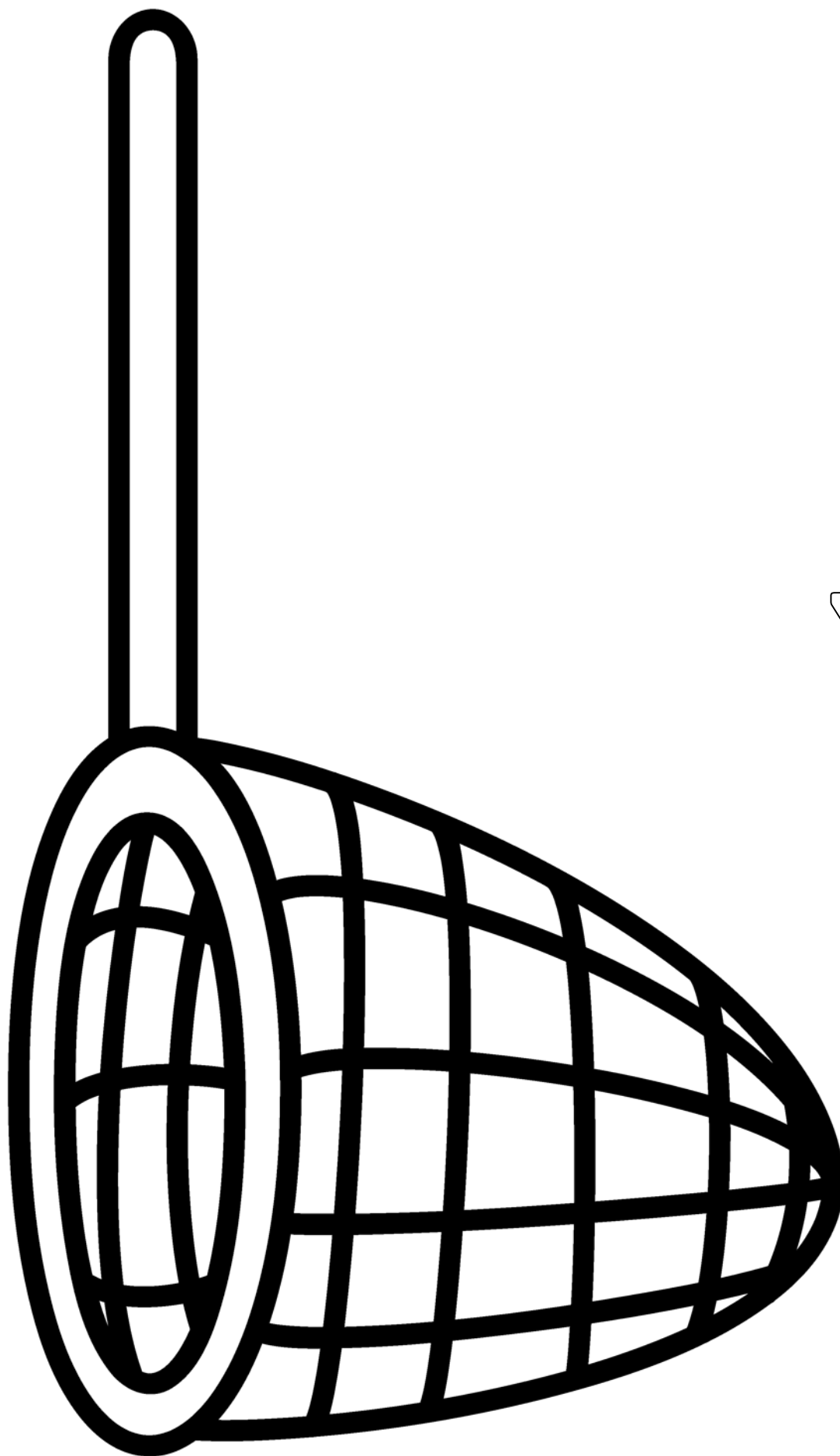
Creatures that would be too large for the net will be placed with blue tack outside the net. There is really no right or wrong answer. The objective is to teach the child to think about size and use their imagination.

When finished, count how many creatures are outside the net and how many are inside the net. You can also use the net for simple subtraction and addition.

Net Game

Print and cut out creatures. Use blue tack to place inside or outside the net on the net card based upon which creatures are small and which are large.

Nighthawk Puppet Craft

Directions: This nighthawk craft can be used to create a puppet.

Activities: Grown-ups can help the child assemble the puppet.

Use feathers, yarn, string, pom-poms or other “furry” embellishments for animal’s fur. You can add “google” eyes for the eyes. Use puffy paint, finger-paints, colored sand, or other art supplies to add texture.

You can use this puppet to tell stories or you can use it in song, such as “Old McDonald had a Farm.” The nighthawk can be used as a teaching tool – tell your child about the sounds he makes, where he lives and what food he likes to eat.

These puppet pieces are designed to be used with a standard brown bag lunch sack that measures 10 5/8 x 5 1/8 x 3 1/8 inches.

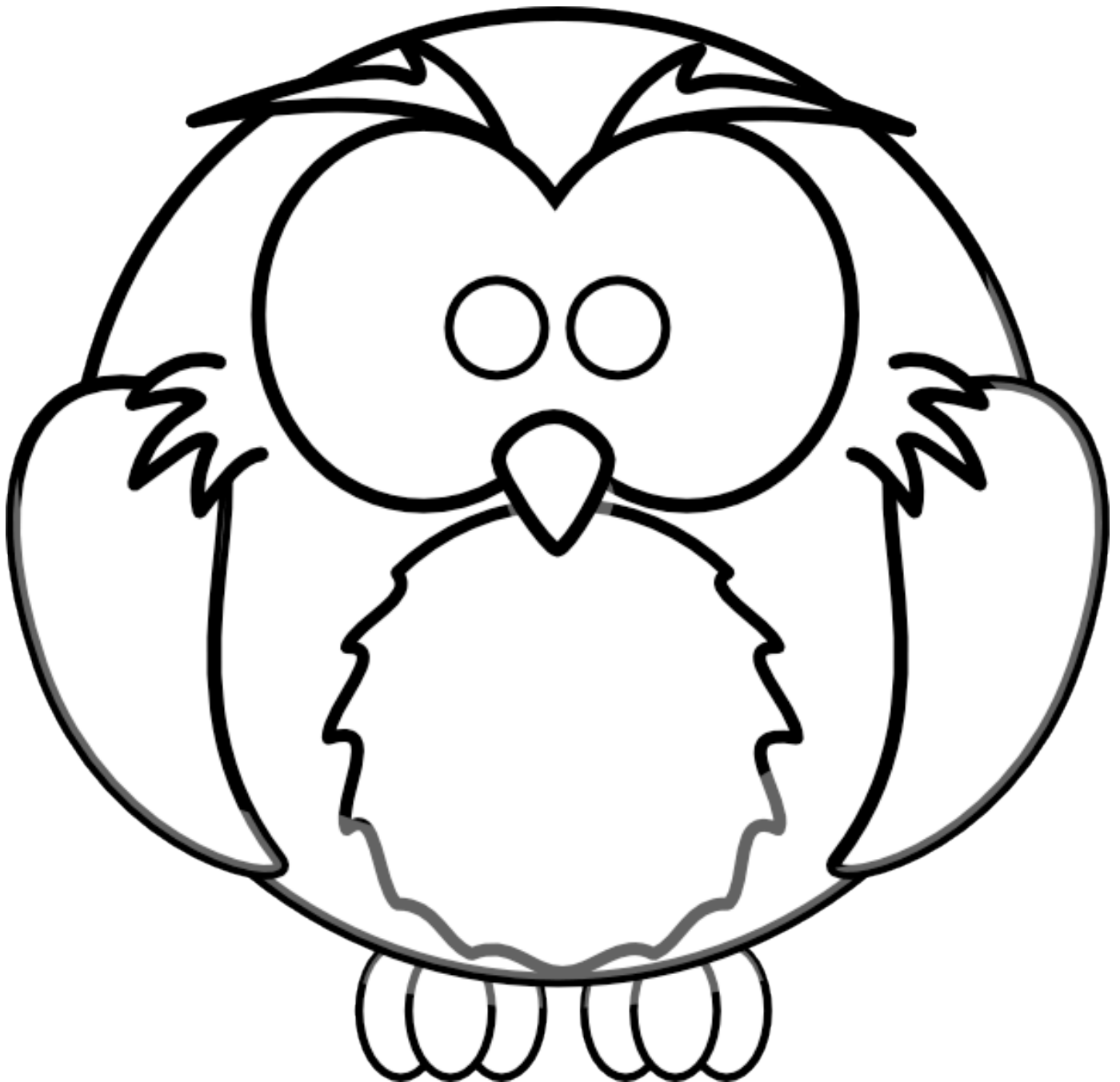
Have fun creating this nighthawk storytelling puppet with your little-one(s).



Nighthawk: Easy to assemble. Just cut into two parts – the head and the body. Paste the face/head onto the bottom of the brown paper sack so that when you move the “mouth” of the sack it looks as though the puppet is talking. Feel free to embellish as desired.

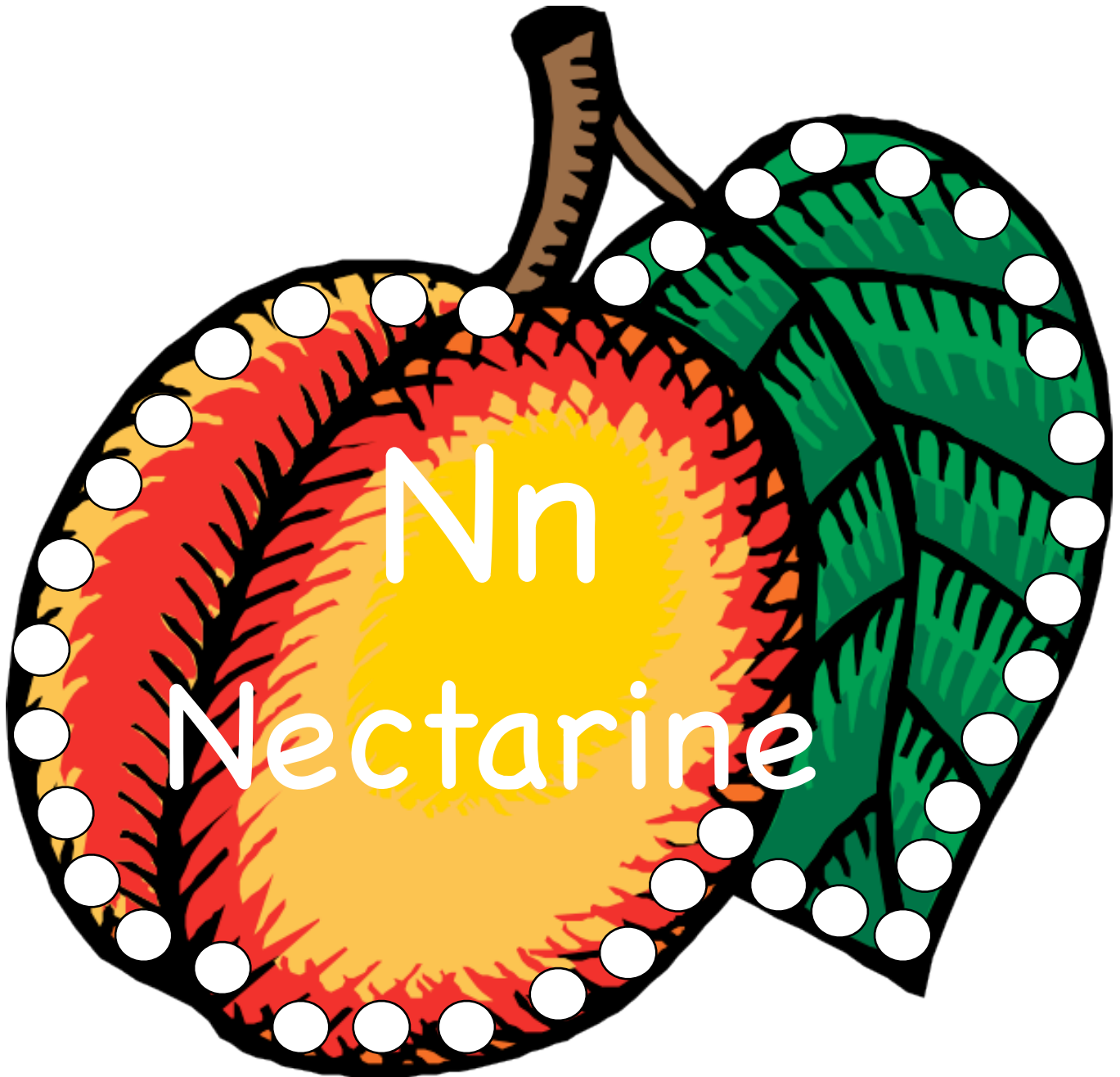
Make a Nighthawk Puzzle Craft

Print out the moose from the previous page and create “puzzle” pieces from it. Use simple shapes to create the puzzle. Ask your child to glue the pieces back together into the shape of a moose. You can use this black and white image as a guide. If desired you could also use this as a coloring page.



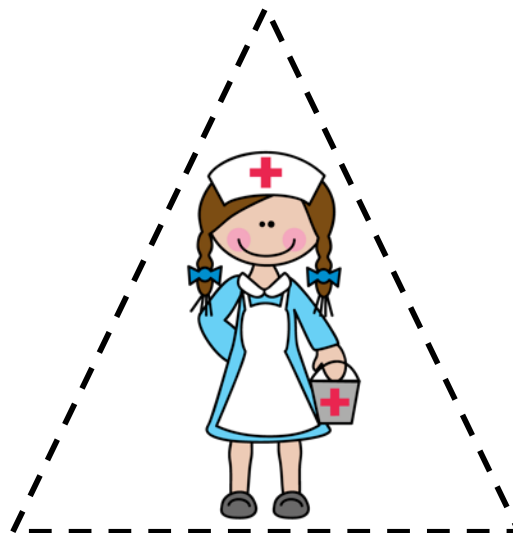
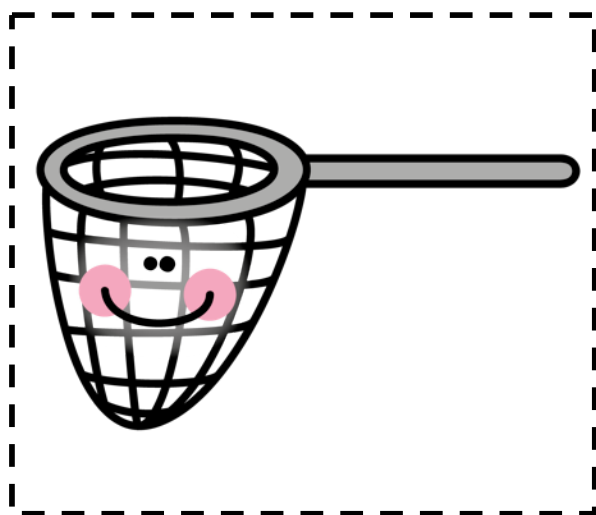
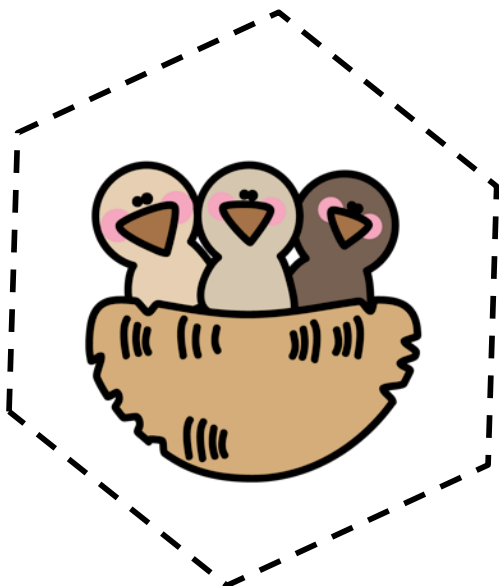
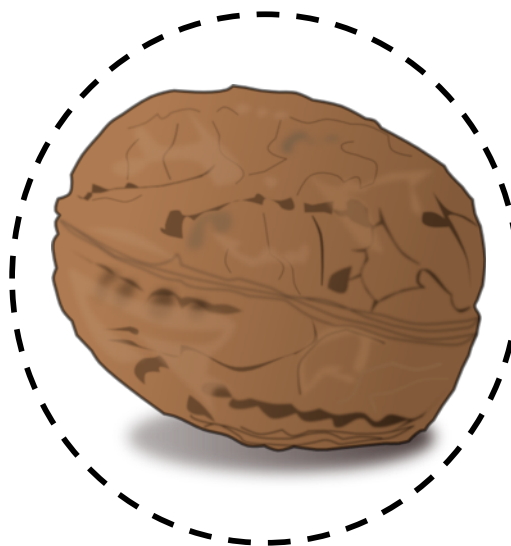
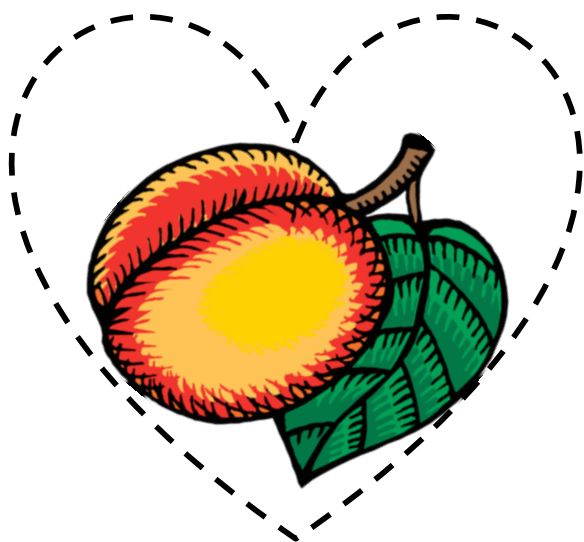
Nectarine Lace-Up

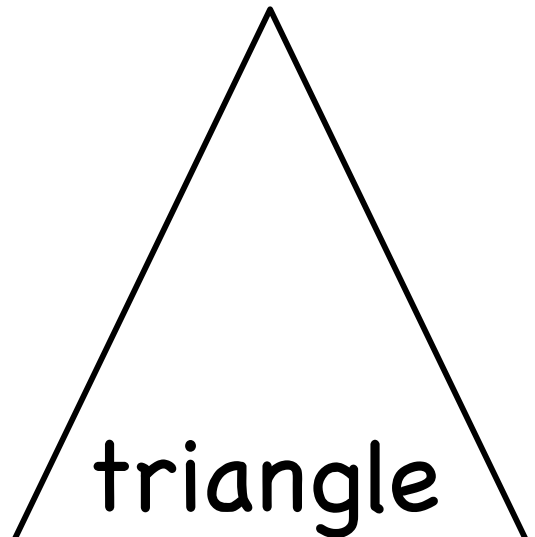
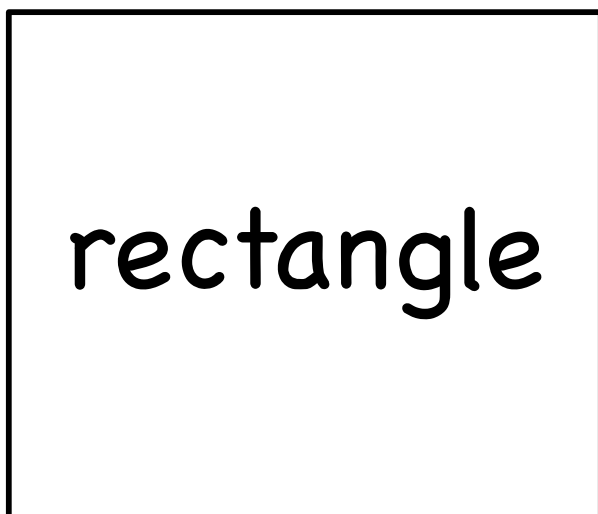
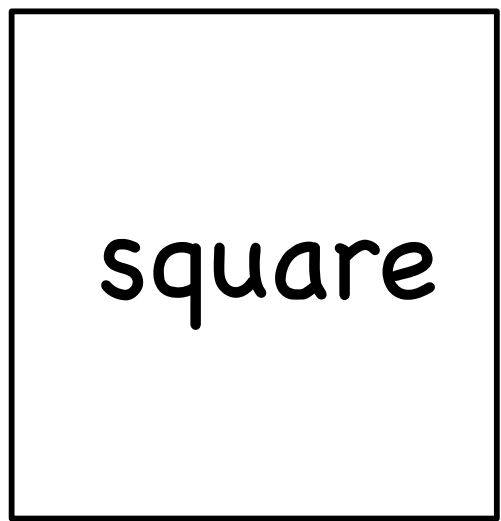
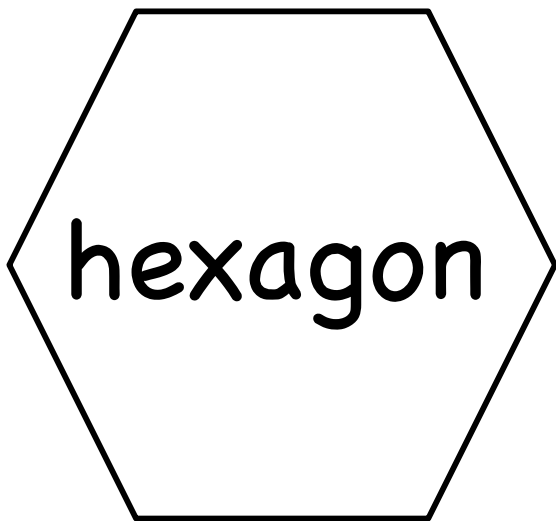
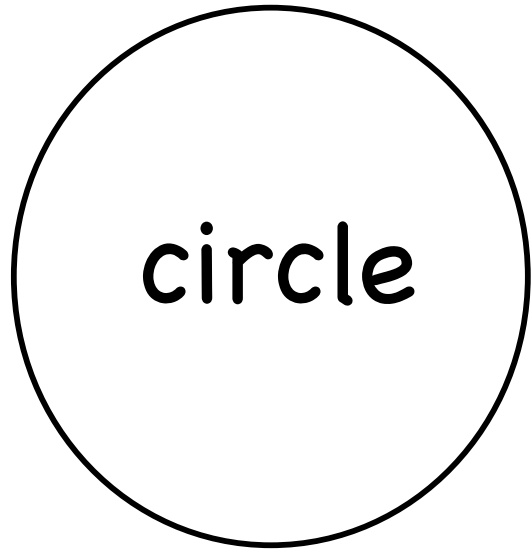
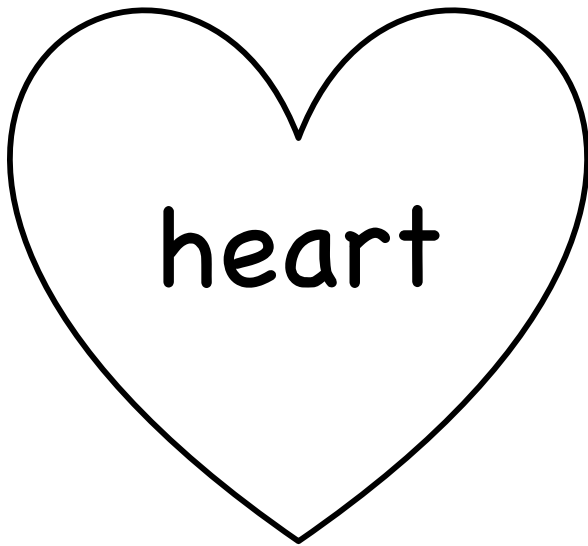
Cutting Practice

Grown-up: help child cut out along dotted line. Discuss shapes.



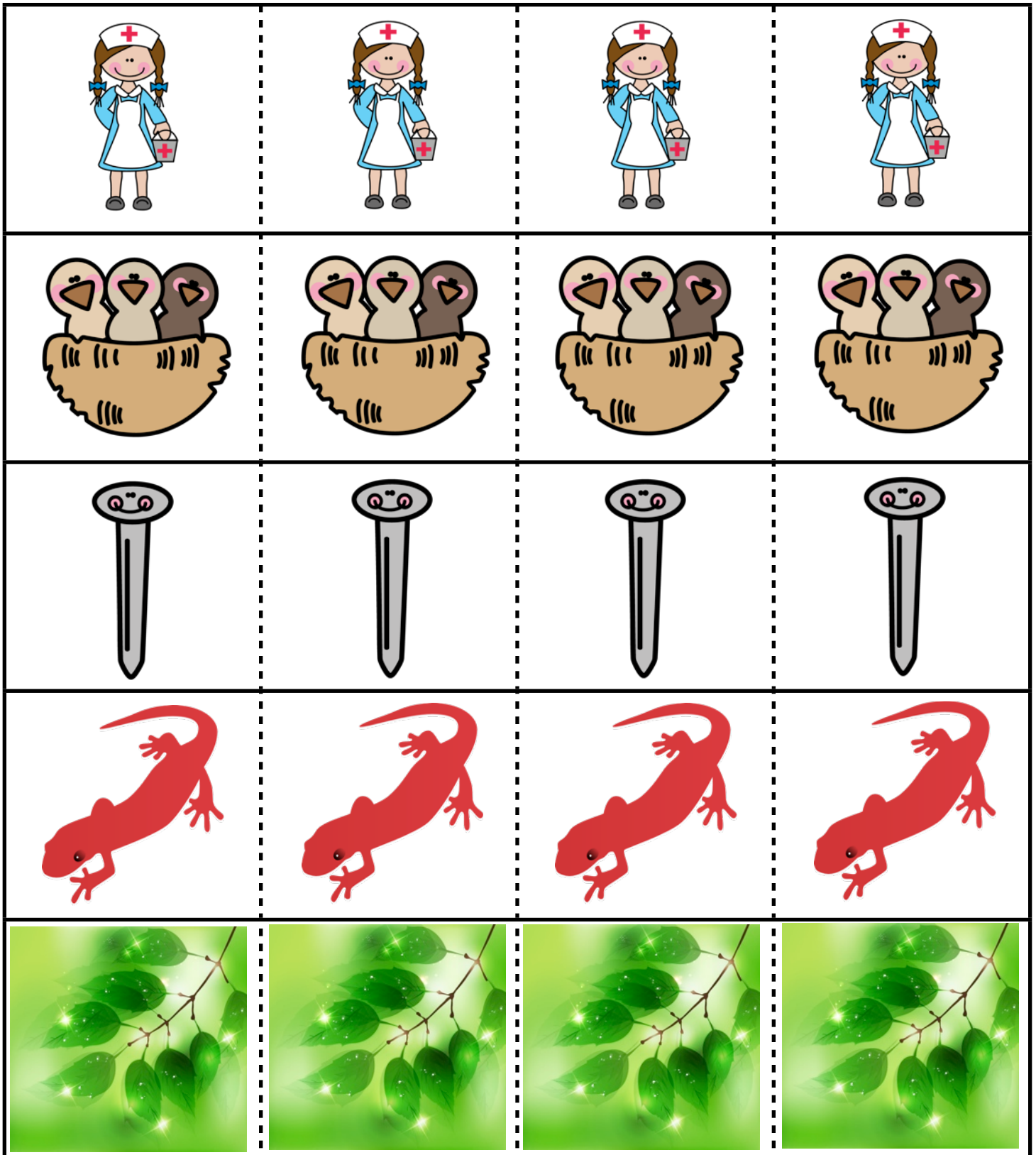

Point out qualities of various shapes. Cut out and align.





Have child cut along dotted lines.

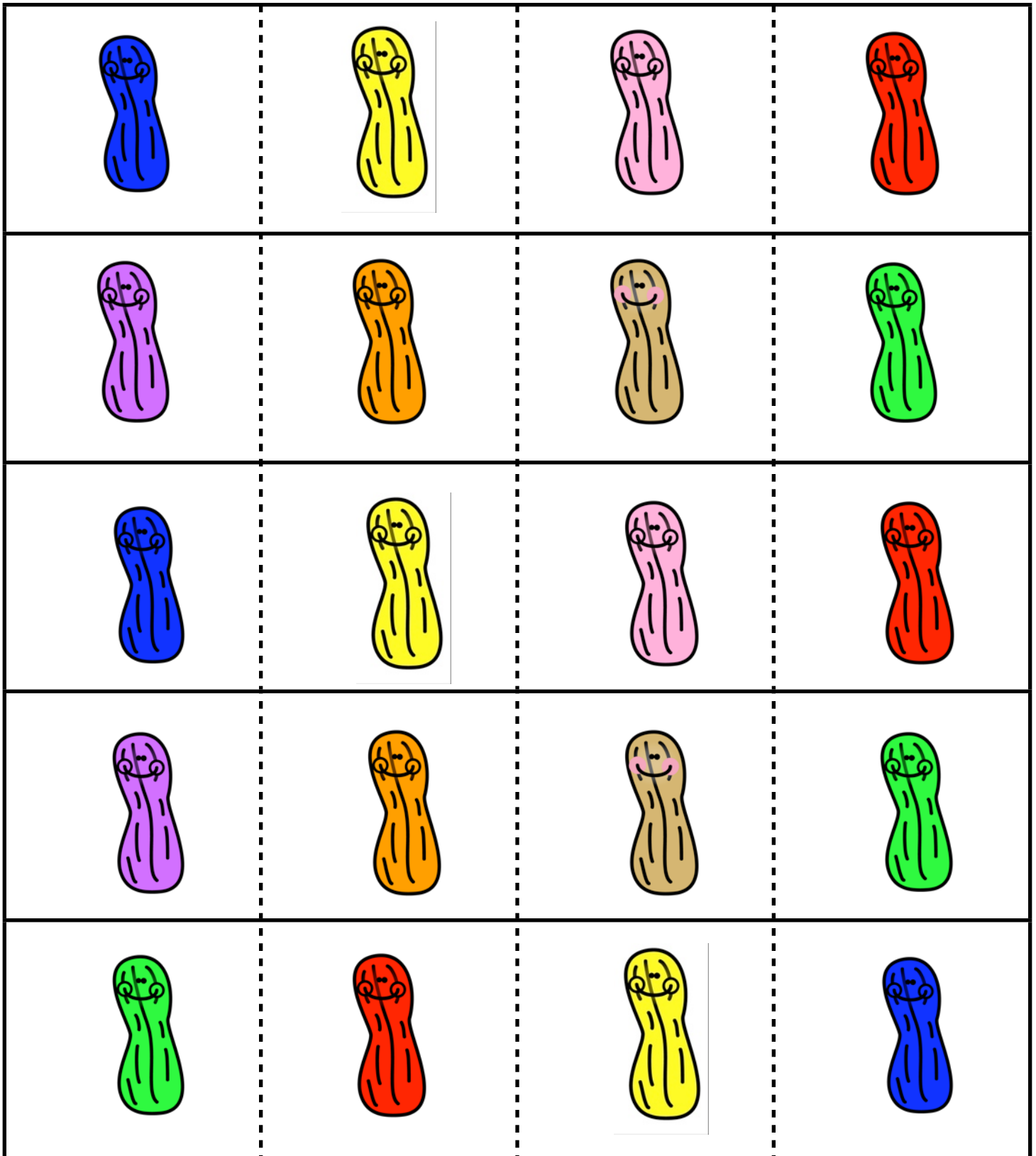
