Simply insert these cards into the clear pockets of the Carson Dellosa dice. These first 12 cards are all actions that start with the letter “h”. You can use stuffed animals for the child to act out these words. You may have to plan ahead, such as laying out some toys for the child to “hold” or using flash cards from previous lessons so the child can hover like a bird or bee (or any other animal you name).

Review the words and consider how you will play out the game activities. You may need some stuffed wild animals that your child can “hunt”. If you have more than one child you can make certain activities into a race. Once you’ve determined how you’d like the child (or the stuffed animal via the child) to act out the various words, have the child roll the dice and have fun.

In this section there are eight words to use with one dice. This helps The child learn about animals and location of body parts. Roll the dice and have your child act out as if they were the animal. You can use a stuffed animal as an actor as well. If you really want to go nuts, roll a verb and then animal/body-part. Encourage child to do the verb the way the animal would. Be creative and have fun! (pick 6 out of 8)

# Horse Craft

**Directions:** This horse craft can be used to create a horse puppet or a puzzle.

**Activities:** Grown-ups can help the child assemble the puppet. There are two versions of the horse puppet. An “easy” to assemble puppet and a more “complex” version that requires more effort to cut, color, and glue to put together.

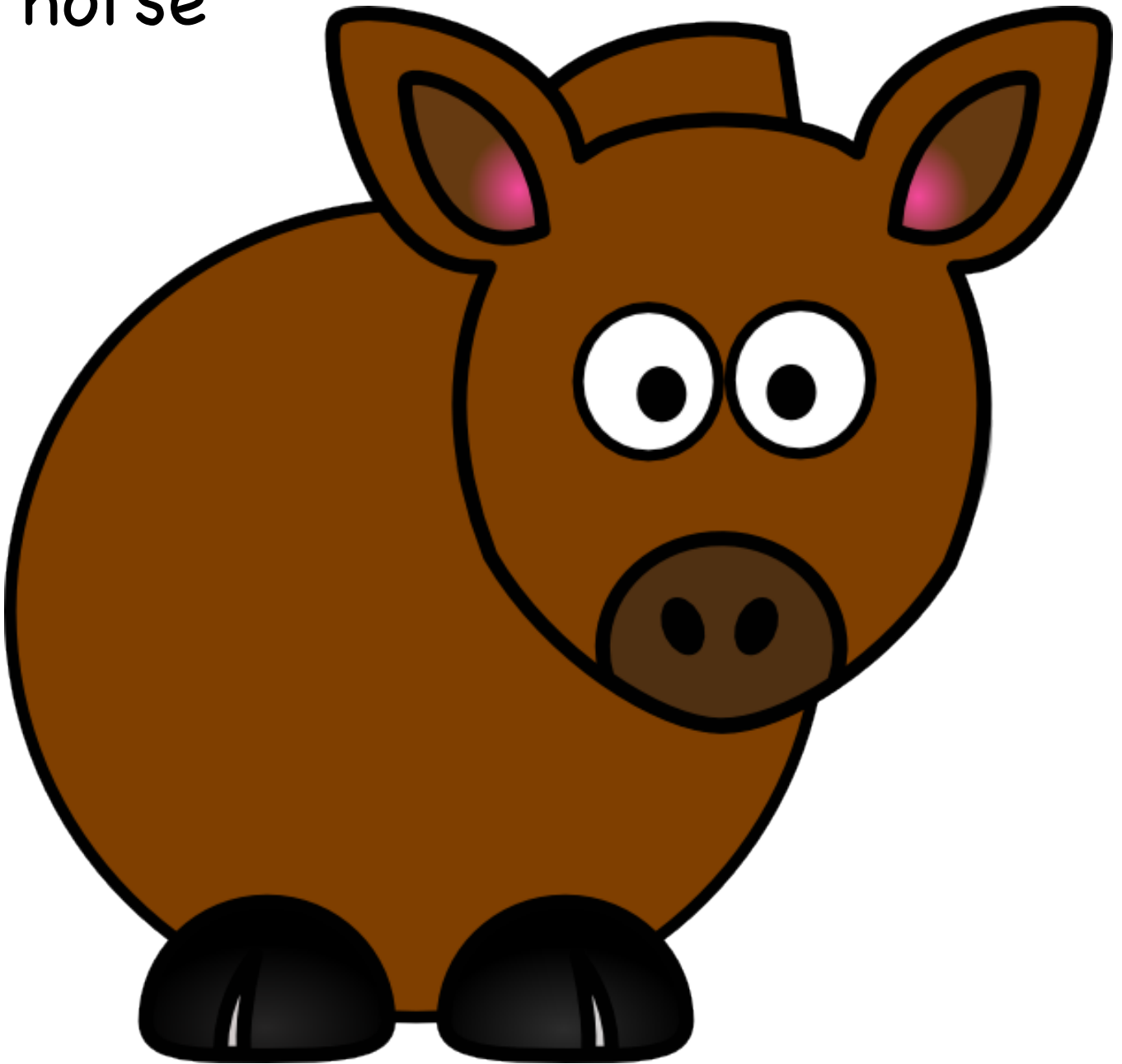
Use yarn, string, pom-poms or other “furry” embellishments for animal’s fur. You can add “google” eyes for the eyes. Use puffy paint, finger-paints, colored sand, or other art supplies to add texture.

You can use this puppet to tell stories or you can use it in song, such as “Old McDonald had a Farm.” The horse can be used as a teaching tool – tell your child about the sounds he makes, where he lives and what food he likes to eat.

These puppet pieces are designed to be used with a standard brown bag lunch sack that measures 10 5/8 x 5 1/8 x 3 1/8 inches.

Have fun creating this horse storytelling puppet with your little-one(s).

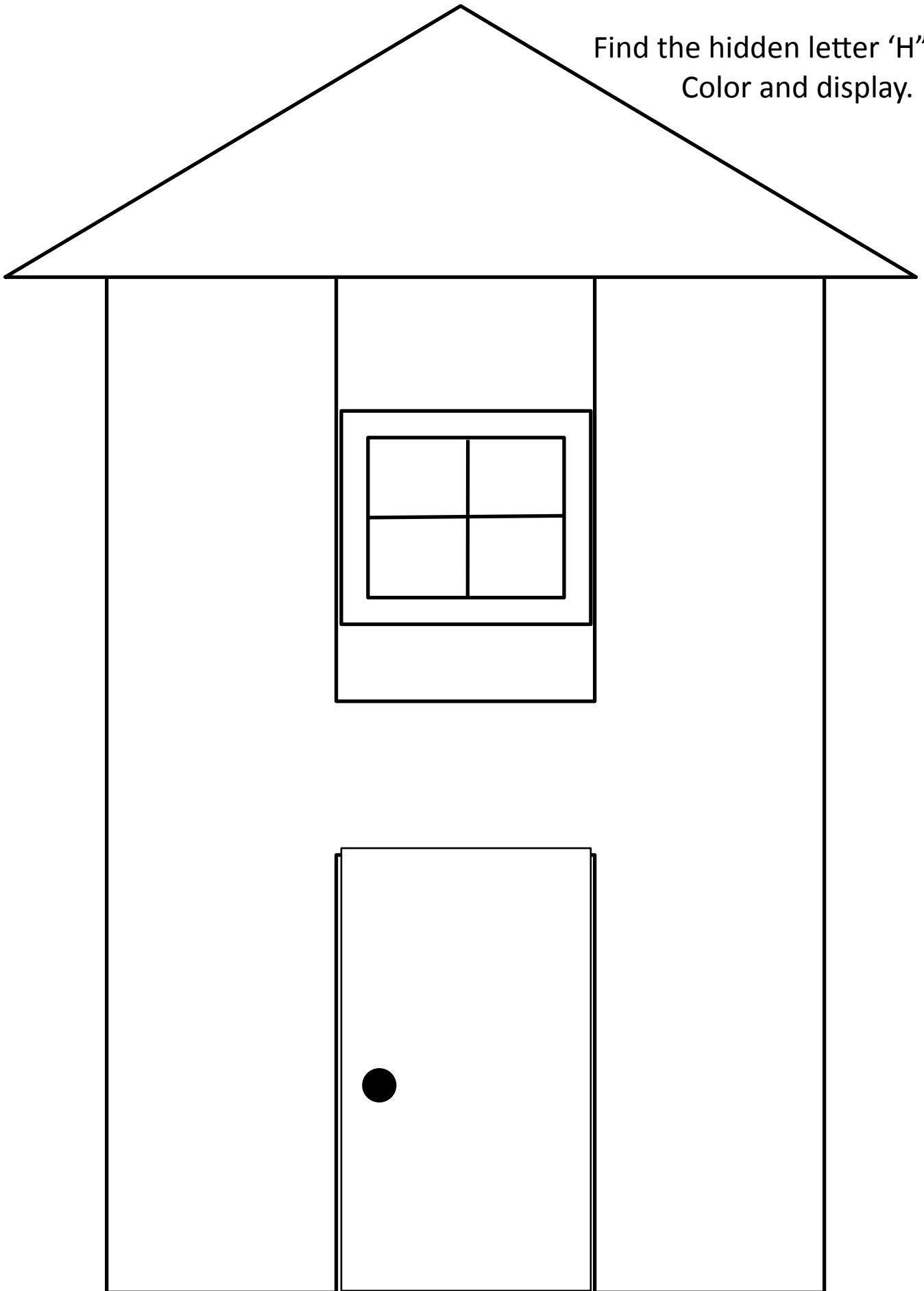
Easy to assemble version. Just cut into two parts – the head and the body. Paste the face/head onto the bottom of the brown paper sack so that when you move the “mouth” of the sack it looks as though the puppet is talking. Feel free to embellish as desired.

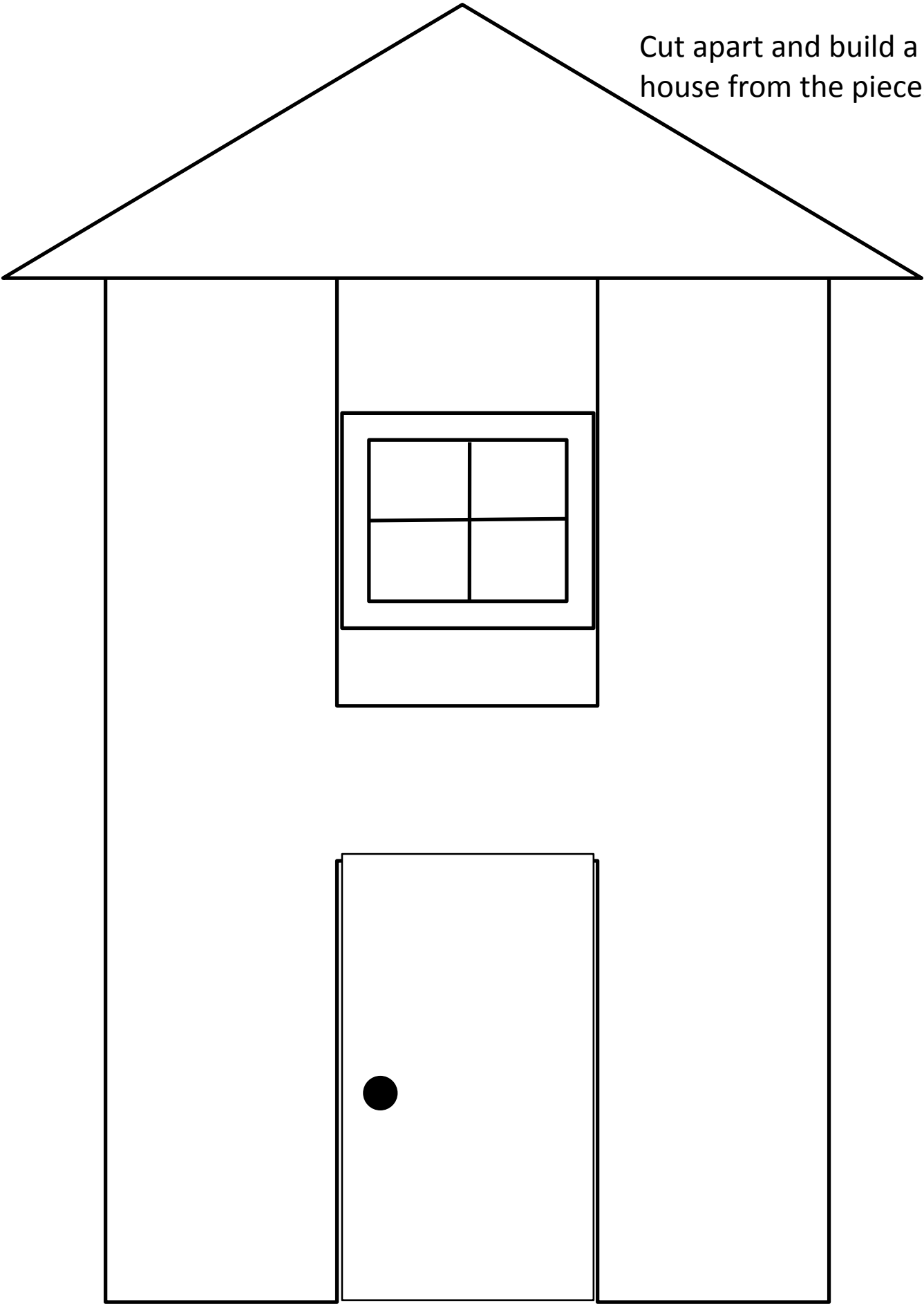


This version is more complex but allows you to challenge your child to piece together the parts of a puzzle. The adult or the child can color each piece and then cut and assemble the puppet. This version will be a bit smaller than the previous version, but it's the extra-effort required by this version that makes it more of a craft. Once the face and body are assembled, glue the face onto the bottom of the brown paper sack so that when you move the "mouth" of the sack it looks as though the puppet is talking. Feel free to embellish as desired.

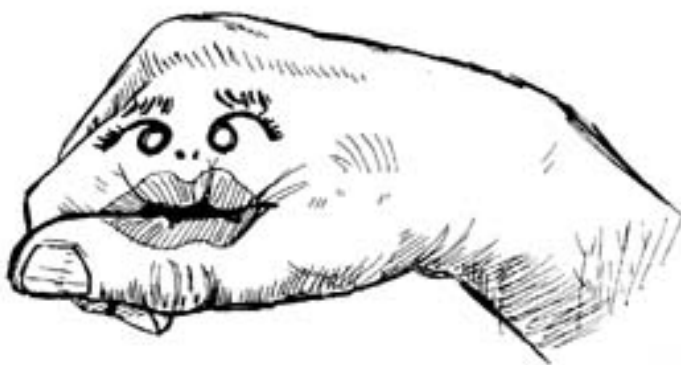

# Letter H Games

**Hide-and-Seek** – In this game one person hides while the other seeks. More than one child can hide at the same time. The “seeking” player closes their eyes and starts to count. He or she counts as high as the group has agreed to count while the other(s) hide. The first person found becomes the next “seeker”. Variations include playing with objects or stuffed animals that are hiding. These can be hidden by an adult or another child.



**Hand Puppets** – Using markers or makeup, an adult creates a hand puppet – illustrated above. Sure to lead to lots of laughter and giggles for young children.

**Hand Shadow Puppets** – Teach your child how to make shadow puppets using their hands. Dim the lights in the room and place a lamp at one end of the room. Hang a bed sheet at the opposite end of the room and make hand puppets by placing hands near the lamp and casting a hand-puppet shadow onto the bed sheet.



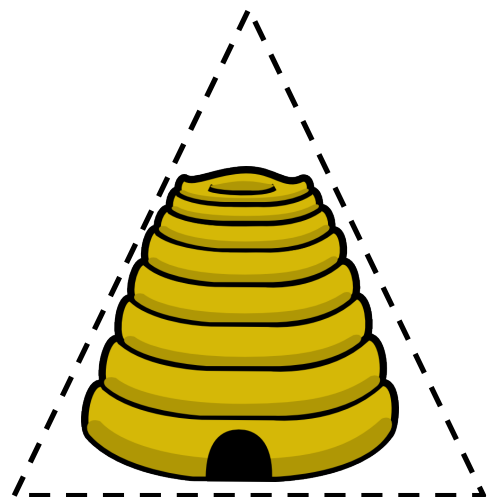
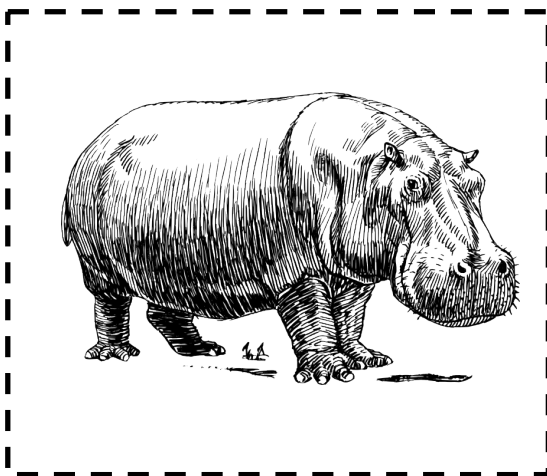
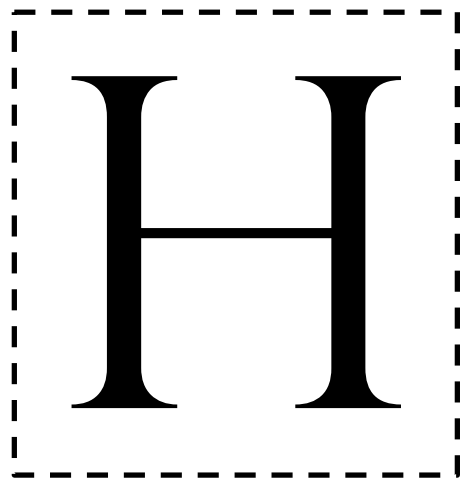
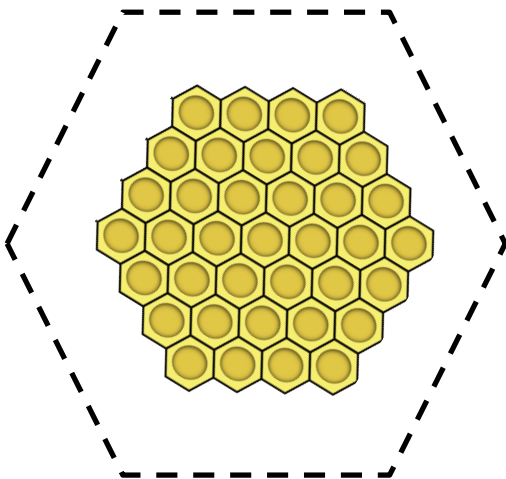
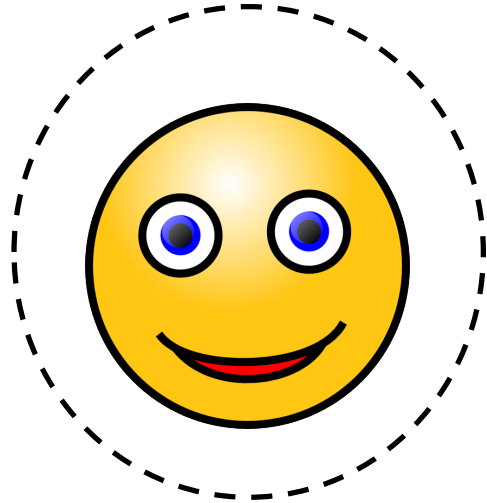
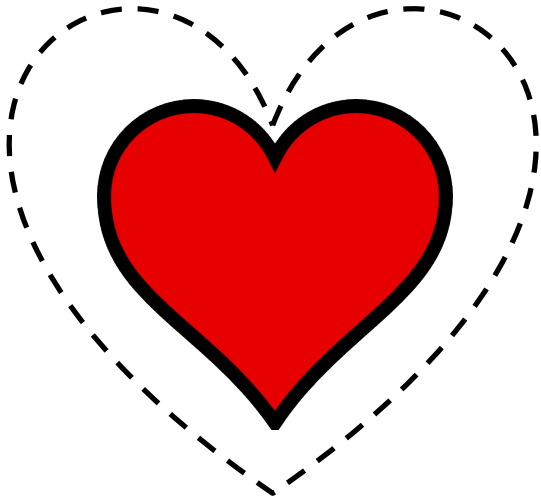
# Hamburger Lace-up

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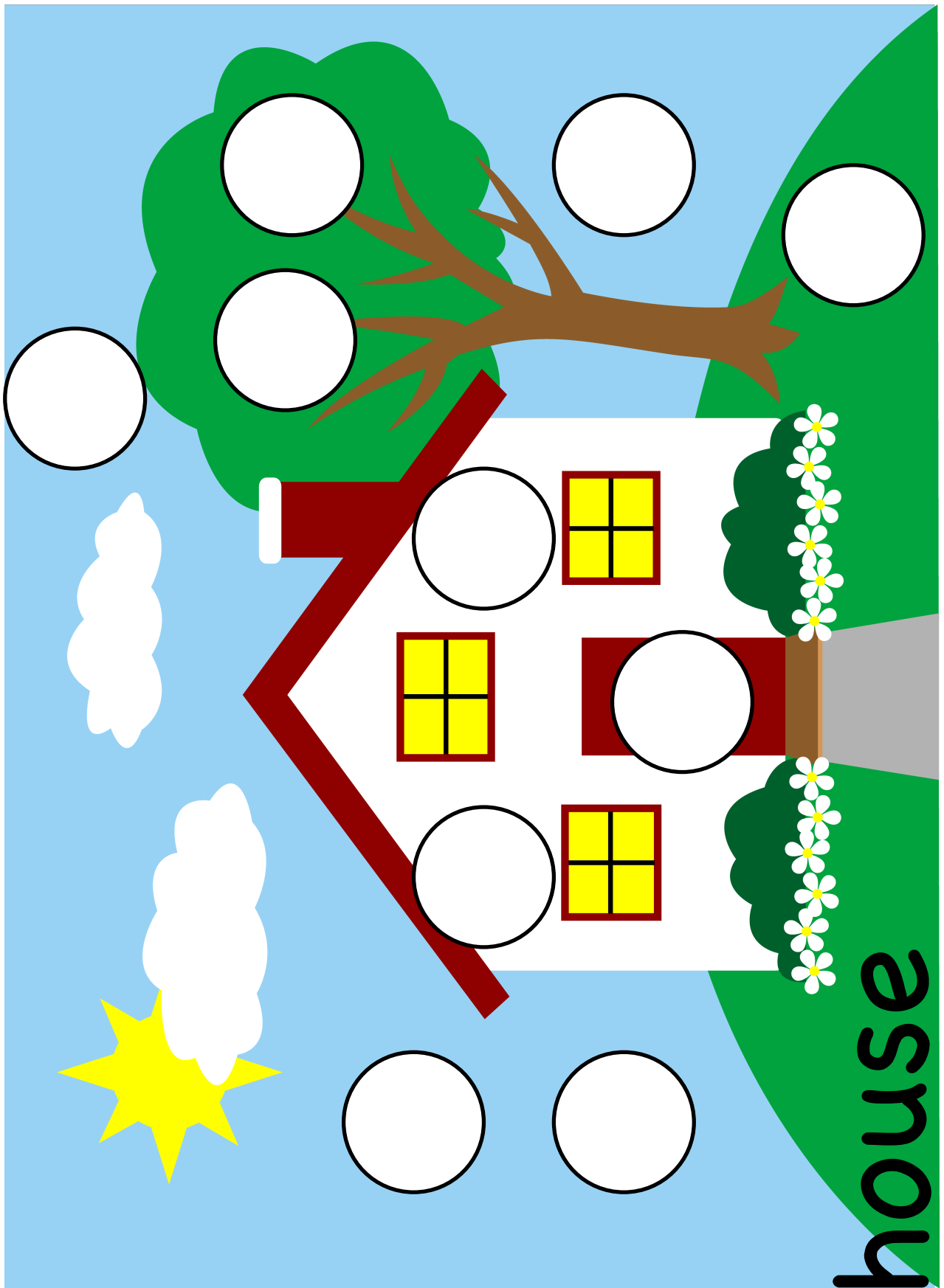
This is a great activity to complete with do-a-dot paints. You can also provide your child with stickers, pom-poms or some other small object to fill in the white circles.

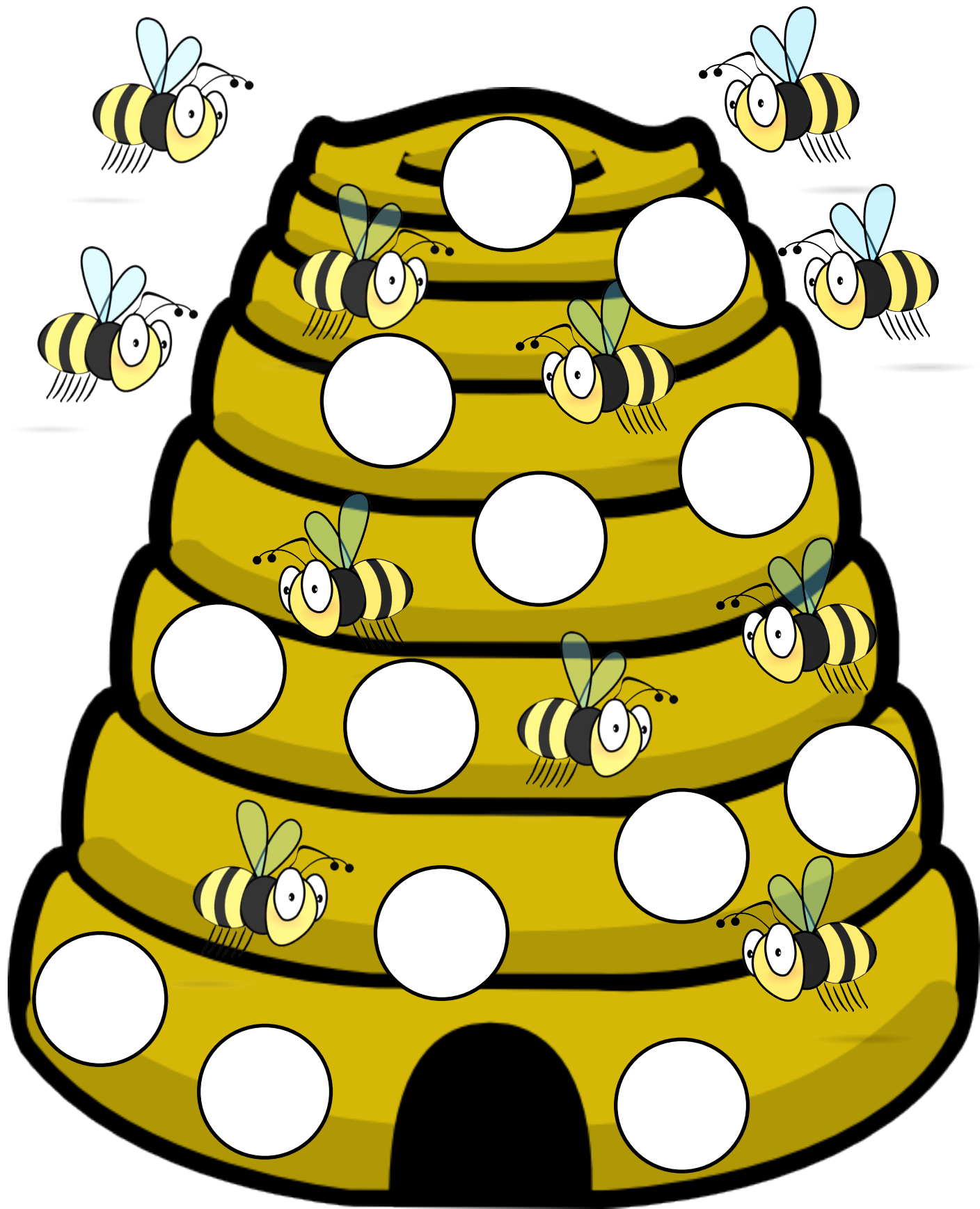

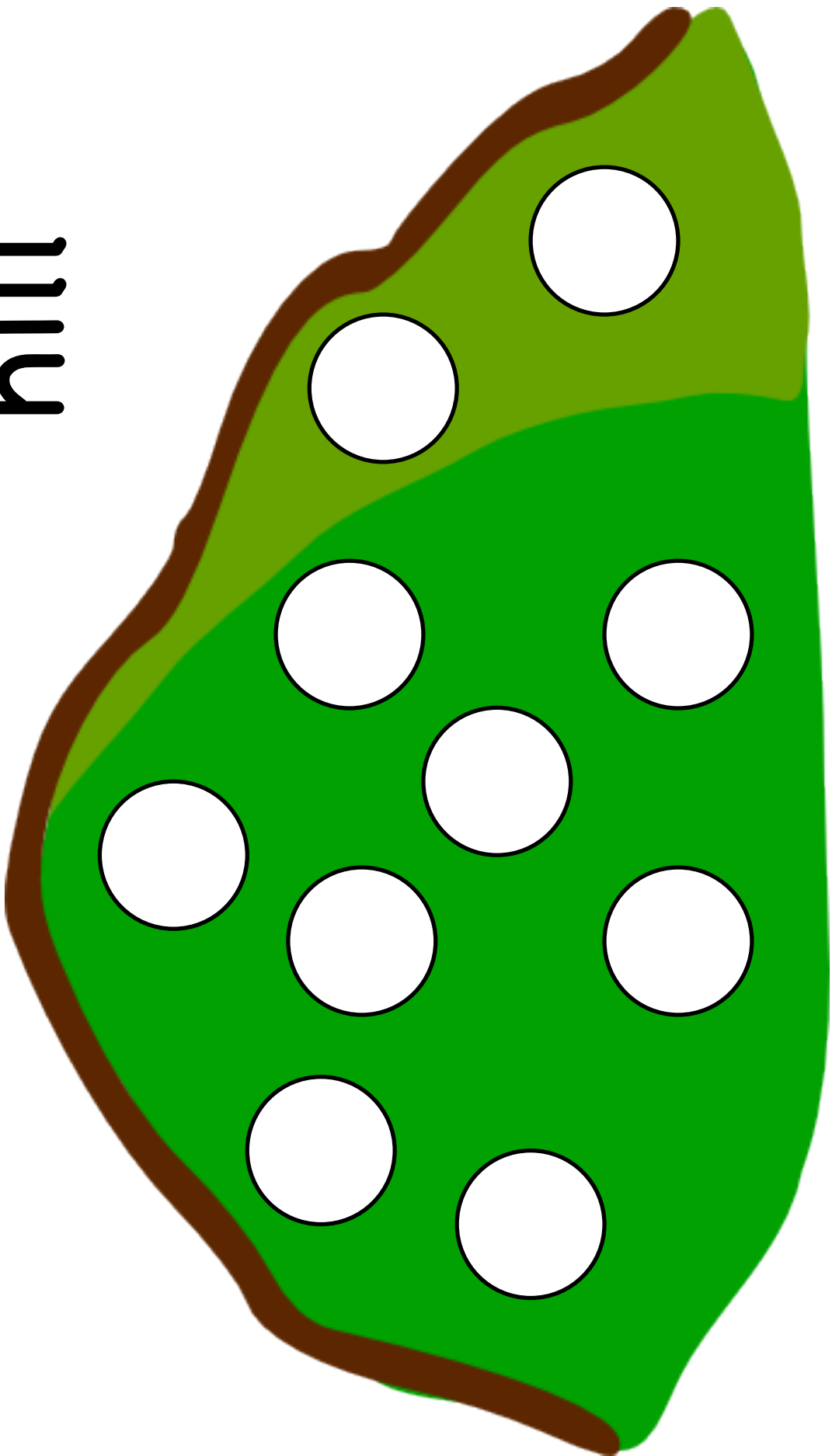
